# Do you know....

## - ... if a student's behavior changes dramatically.

It could mean that the student is in distress. Symptoms to watch for:

- mood changes
- withdrawal
- drop in performance
- lack of self-care
- physical symptoms: frequent headaches, stomach aches
- risky behavior
- expressions of hopelessness

## • ...what to do when addressing a student in distress?

- Validate and **thank** the student for trusting you and sharing try to stay away from saying "I'm sorry".
  - "Thank you so much for sharing that with me"
  - "That sounds like a lot to be going through right now."
  - "It took a lot of courage to take this step and talk to me."
- **Remind** the student that you are a mandatory reporter
- Refer the student to appropriate resources

# Special Concerns...

- Suicidal ideations or violent expressions
  - call 911
- Requests for confidentiality
  - if student doesn't want to report or doesn't know, refer to VAVP. Use left sidebar for other confidential resources.

## **Mandatory Reporting**

Responsible staff must report the following:

- sex-based harassment sexual assault, dating & domestic violence, and stalking
- sex or gender discrimination
- other forms of sexual misconduct exploitation, verbal comments
