Community Spotlight *Regis Berkeley Community Garden*

At the northwest corner of the Regis University campus, down a narrow sidewalk and under a grape arbor, lies the quiet and fertile **Regis University Berkeley Community <u>Garden</u>**. Established in 2010, the garden is a partnership between Regis University and **Denver Urban Gardens**. With 25 available 11-by-16-foot plots, campus employees and nearby residents toil in the dirt to grow food for themselves and proudly donate excess produce to local food banks.

The Community Garden has been successful from the start because of the unwavering commitment of the volunteer garden leaders. Leadership comes from Regis employees and community members, and they all share in the management of the garden. From pest and weed control, to educational workshops, to potlucks, happy hours and workdays, the volunteer leaders oversee structured duties and processes throughout the season to maintain the beauty and fun of the space.

Garden plots can be reserved for \$52 per season, a fee that includes water on an automatic drip line for each plot. The garden has one raised bed for accessibility to those who may need it.

Any unclaimed beds will be cultivated by the other the members and volunteers, and the harvest will be donated. The goal is to create space for anyone who wants to garden.
